ABOUT THE CAMPSITE & THE PROJECT

Camping de la Bastide will be your home base during this cycling holiday. This charming 3-star campsite, with 28 pitches and 10 mobile homes, is nestled between Saint-Émilion and Bergerac, right on the edge of the Dordogne (one of the cleanest rivers in France) and is just a 5-minute walk to a beautiful 13th-century town, where one of the best markets in France takes place.

The campsite has been run by Peter since 2009, who has built a loyal following thanks to his reputation for going above and beyond for his guests. More recently, Peter's son Daniel who is a passionate cyclist himself, has created this project and will be your main point of contact. With his extensive knowledge of the best routes, he'll ensure you get on the road safely and quickly.

THE GRAND TOUR'S TOP 4 CYCLING ITINERARIES

ITINERARY ONE

Sainte-Foy-La-Grande -> Monbazillac -> Issigeac -> Mouleydier -> Bergerac

This itinerary takes you along peaceful country roads that wind through apple orchards, vineyards, and alongside the Dordogne River, leading you to the charming village of Monbazillac. Here, you'll find a 16th-century château offering breathtaking views over the Dordogne Valley, making it the perfect spot for a scenic break.

The next stop is the medieval town of Issigeac, renowned for its vibrant Sunday market, ranked among the top ten food markets in France. After soaking in the lively atmosphere and sampling local delicacies, you'll cycle north to the picturesque village of Mouleydier. From there, follow the V91 cycle path, which meanders along the serene Dordogne River, taking you all the way to Bergerac. This route beautifully combines local culture, rich history, and stunning landscapes, offering an unforgettable cycling experience through one of France's most captivating regions.



ITINERARY TWO

Sainte-Foy-La-Grande -> Saint-Cyprien -> Sarlat

For this itinerary, you will take the train from Sainte-Foy-la-Grande to the lovely town of Saint-Cyprien, with a scenic one-hour journey through the Dordogne countryside. From there, you'll cycle to the medieval riverside town of Beynac, following quiet roads that run alongside the train tracks and offer beautiful views of the Dordogne River.

After exploring Beynac, you will continue through several of France's «Most Beautiful Villages»: Castelnaud-la-Chapelle, with its impressive château, La Roque-Gageac, nestled along the cliffs, and Domme, offering panoramic valley views. On the way to Sarlat, you can also visit the stunning Marqueyssac Gardens, perched above the valley with magnificent views, and the historic Château de Castelnaud, a well-preserved fortress rich in medieval history.



THE GRAND TOUR'S TOP 4 CYCLING ITINERARIES

ITINERARY THREE

Sainte-Foy-La-Grande -> Montcaret -> Saint-Michel-de-Montaigne -> Saint-Emilion

You will leave the campsite cycling through the 13th Century Bastide of Sainte-Foy-La-Grande, you will then climb the first hill of the ride leading you to prune orchards overlooking the Dordogne River. Further along, you will cycle along 10 kilometers of constant vineyards producing wine under the Sainte-Foy-Bordeaux classification.

You will divert from the vineyards to ride through the beautiful village of Pessac-sur-Dordogne which borders the river. From there, you will make your way to Montcaret where there is an archeological site, then by riding through an off-road track lined by vines, you will make your way up to Château Michel de Montaigne.

You will continue to make your way towards Saint-Emilion by passing through the most famous vineyards and châteaux in the world. You can then wander the streets of Saint-Emilion and enjoy a few sneaky wine tastings.



ITINERARY FOUR

Sainte-Foy-La-Grande -> Prigonrieux -> Bergerac -> Lalinde -> Tremolat

Enjoy a 75 km bike journey to the picturesque village of Tremolat. You'll cycle along the famous V91 bike path, which runs beside the Dordogne River. The route takes you through the charming town of Bergerac and a series of traditional French villages, offering a perfect mix of scenic landscapes and local culture. The path is shaded by trees, providing a pleasant and peaceful ride as you pass vineyards and river views.

After reaching the Tuilières dam, it's just a short ride to Tremolat. Once you've completed the route, you can catch the 6 PM train from Tremolat to Sainte-Foy-la-Grande, a 45-minute journey that allows you to relax and reflect on the day's adventure. This bike ride offers a great blend of nature, local heritage, and easy travel, making it a memorable experience for any cyclist.
